



summer research program for Indigenous youth

STEM fields are critical in advancing health care and driving economic success in Canada, yet Indigenous representation in these skilled, well-paid positions remains disproportionately low. seed2STEM, a summer research program for Indigenous high school students in Metro Vancouver and Kelowna, aims to increase Indigenous participation in STEM. seed2STEM offers Indigenous high school students from grades 9 to 12 paid, six-week summer research internships on a variety of STEM (science, technology, engineering, math) topics in a fun and supportive environment.

Host labs needed


Are you a faculty member in a STEM field? Host a student this summer!

You provide a research project and supervision, seed2STEM provides full or partial student salaries, administrative and logistical support, plus student group activities on Mondays.

seed2STEM runs from Monday July 7 until Friday August 15, 2025. Students work 20 hours/week Tuesday to Friday (exact schedule is up to you!). Supervisors are offered Indigenous awareness and cultural safety training and are invited to the celebration lunch and poster session on August 15.
