He did his medical oncology training at BC Cancer, followed by a translational research fellowship and MSc at MD Anderson Cancer Center, before returning to Vancouver.

His main research interest is in biomarker discovery in ctDNA and clinical trials in colorectal cancer and neuroendocrine tumors.

He is the US NCI Colon Cancer Task Force Co-Chair, a member of the ASCO Evidence Based Medicine Committee and is the Co-Lead for the Correlative Sciences and Tumor Biology Committee at the CCTG.
